We just awarded \$20,000 in scholarships in June. Begun two years ago year and endowed in perpetuity, is the Susan McIntosh Lloyd Scholarship awarded to a student or students pursuing one or more of Sue's passions of music, farming, and forestry.

We have heard from prior scholarship recipients that a grant is particularly helpful in the 2nd year and beyond of college when many other grants are discontinued. Funds have been used to pay for tuition, room and board, computers, books, commuting, childcare and various other expenses. Many students are graduating with significant debt, and this fund helps them to reduce their long-term financial burden.

We are reaching out to the greater Tinmouth Community to ask for your financial support to continue this effort and grow our fund. Currently funds raised come from private individuals and the proceeds of the Tinmouth Plant Sale (thank you, gardeners!). We have also benefited from gains in the stock market. All donations made to this fund go to our endowed fund at the Vermont Community Foundation and are fully tax deductible.
